

# Communism, The Inevitable Result of Capitalism?

## Preface

In August of 2019 I wrote an article titled: "Socialism or Fascism: a look at the inevitable result of capitalism and how we really have a choice". In the article I made the case that the values that people hold dear in their heart of hearts, playing well with others, sharing with others, helping others in need, and honesty are the core of socialism.

In contrast the capitalist system naturally leads to winners and losers. Once people have a money advantage over others that money can be used as leverage to compound the inequity; it rewards greed. And that inequity will inevitably escalate. Winners become bigger winners and people who don't play the money game lose.

In the summer of 2020, gathering to organize against the totalitarian rules being imposed ostensibly because of Covid, I had a few brief frustrating discussions with people who disparaged socialism, equating socialism with communism. Or at least insisting that socialism leads to communism. I had major resistance to their seeing the slide into totalitarianism as a slide into communism. Their conflation of socialism and communism seemed like it was coming from a very knee-jerk right wing patriot vs. commy mentality.

This paper will not take any time to look at the ways socialism could work. (Or does work - traffic lights, fire departments, road departments, water, sanitation, etc.) Rather the purpose of this paper is to look at where it seems the Global Coup's new normal is headed, which I now, having said all that above, believe *will* be a form of communism, not completely unlike Soviet communism. But in this case it will not be socialism that has lead to it but instead will have been capitalism.

## Capitalism in Essence

As mentioned in the preface, money offers leverage to those who pursue wealth and use it to their advantage. Thus the capitalist system empowers an elite class (it always has and always will – it's baked in) who decide how everything is organized and imposes their order on the vast majority of the population. This elite class locks the system in by

controlling the resources, the means of production, the media, the finances, and the government; they make all the rules.

This leads naturally to totalitarianism. Even if not manifested in absolute dictates and a clear police enforcement of those dictates, it none the less creates a system that is stratified where the essentials of life, not just food, shelter, and water, but ease and comfort are easily available for a few, available with lots of hard (sanctioned, paying) work for most, and barely or not at all available for those living outside the paradigm.

## Europe, the West, the Heart of Capitalism

Society naturally goes through cycles. In the time of the European kings and queens they had absolute power. They had their elite battles for turf with shifting borders and allegiances, while the majority of the populace just went about their lives in their villages, most likely relatively freely within the context of ultimately being subjects.

Eventually most countries developed more democratic forms of government. This might have been the moment humanity was waiting for to be free and maybe to some extent it was - but with the monetary top down system of capitalism. Top down meaning it became comprehensive; it became increasingly difficult to live outside the current monetary system's paradigm.

While offering to more people the opportunity to live a more and more comfortable life and to have more stuff, it also for the first time gave those inclined to greed and power the ability to game the system and to become kings and queens in their own right.

## The Robber Barons

In the late 1800's and the early 1900's the robber barons gained extraordinary wealth and power using money to leverage resources, to control banking, and ultimately the value of money. And, of course, their wealth gave them influence in governments.

Note that this was done (and still is being done) with considerable secrecy and has allowed the average person the illusion that they have the ability to contribute to and influence their lives through their "democracies".

Post World War 2 with the boom of manufacturing offered more luxury and more stuff for more people - at least in the West, as resources to feed that comfortable lifestyle were plundered (as they had been) from less "developed" countries. Again the secrecy; the well meaning (to a large extent) populace having no idea that the affordability of their stuff was causing misery elsewhere.

The late 1900's saw the consolidation of much the economy. Big Box stores became the primary or only option for many products. Many jobs were outsourced. International

trade deals increased not just global trade but global control; the trade deals were rarely, if ever, advantageous for the general populace of any of the countries. Power was increasingly consolidated.

And as the new age robber barons found cheaper labor in the developing countries, the power elite became more global; many of the richest people in the world now are in “communist” China.

## Jump to the Digital Age

With the onset of the digital age, the leverage offered by money accelerated tremendously, leading to unprecedented wealth. And with that unprecedented control. This new elite class is locking the system in by increasing their controlling of the finances, the media, and the government. Their making the rules has become even more comprehensive and pervasive; they have strengthened and reinforced the paradigm that works for them.

While this was happening there was a push for a more socialist governance in many places. However all socialism is not created equal. The Latin American socialists hoped to liberate their people from poverty. The European socialists offered laudable social policies such as socialized medicine. However, as this was happening, in the guise of togetherness the European Union was formed. In essence it could have been a good thing but now the individual European countries were subject to EU “global” rule with minimal citizenry input.

Back in the United States the people clamored for some socialist policies (Americans of all stripes favor Medicare for all) in the midst of a disintegrating shell of a democracy with ever increasingly meaningless jobs, skyrocketing rent, homelessness, and much of the populace medicating against the despair.

By the 2000's with near total surveillance, growing consolidation of mainstream media, and tech giants Google, Facebook, and Twitter all being run by unscrupulous technocrats, and many governments completely unresponsive to the wishes or needs of their populace, the stage was set for the greatest psyop of all time.

## Enter Covid

By the time Covid appeared the powerful elite just needed a catalyst to make the final move to global governance. Whether it was planned or was just dumb luck, the threat of a virus gave them the perfect storm. Totalitarian measures have been implemented all over the world. The messaging via mainstream media, big box social media, and governmental leaders has been homogenized; it appears to those who don't stray from those sources of “authority” as overwhelming consensus.

And the message is that we are all in this together. Comply because these are extraordinary times and yielding to authority is necessary. Daily death counts and horror stories amplify fear. And the messaging keeps changing, using cult tactics to befuddle the fearful into simply waiting for the next news; the next necessary measure that they must adhere to.

Well intended lefties, once skeptical of authority, now en masse feel the necessity to do whatever it takes to protect not just themselves but others.

And now, a year and a half into the panic, while the public is largely compliantly waiting (and waiting) for eventual resolution, they are slowly but surely being nudged into the mindset that the new normal will still require compliance with severe restrictions on a lifestyle that the West used to proudly hail as that of the Free World.

And while this is going on the technocratic elite are not befuddled. They are rolling out a totalitarian state, far more comprehensive and with far more power than most anyone could have ever before imagined.

## The Final Result - Communism Packaged as Social Responsibility

The “need” to change how we live because of climate change, the need to manage resources, respect for minorities and the disadvantaged are the politically correct reasons why we must all sacrifice. And we are told that the world has changed; we are cautioned that killer viruses will likely become more common.

In the end we have global totalitarian rule packaged as a benevolent big brother overseeing worldwide social and ecological responsibility.

As Klaus Schwab, the founder and head of the World Economic Forum, said in his 2019 article, “What Kind of Capitalism Do We Want?”:

Stakeholder capitalism, a model I first proposed a half-century ago, positions private corporations as trustees of society, and is clearly the best response to today’s social and environmental challenges.

In order to achieve this, the World Economic Forum is championing the Great Reset, which we see in Joe Biden’s and Boris Johnson’s “Build Back Better” slogans. And from the Great Reset page of the Forum’s website, they call for people to accept the changes for all the right reasons:

To achieve a better outcome, the world must act jointly and swiftly to revamp all aspects of our societies and economies, from education to social contracts and working conditions. Every country, from the United States to China, must participate, and every industry, from oil and gas to tech, must be transformed. In short, we need a “Great Reset” of capitalism.

We can emerge from this crisis a better world, if we act quickly and jointly. The changes we have already seen in response to Covid-19 prove that a reset of our economic and social foundations is possible. This is our best chance to instigate stakeholder capitalism.

This is the future envisioned for the human race by the elite technocrats. It will resemble Soviet communism in the sense that a centralized governing bureaucracy will dictate everything. The state will provide for you (at the cost of your emotional and spiritual needs and your freedom) but you are under the state's thumb. But unlike Soviet communism it will be implemented with digital IDs, total surveillance, biometric monitoring, and with algorithms and artificial intelligence policing - a really big thumb.

Totalitarianism is the inevitable result of capitalism. Totalitarianism can, however, take many forms; much depends on the nature of the populace being ruled. Unlike a totalitarian state imposed after a violent coup, the Global Coup's new normal totalitarianism, following the mother of all psyops, and packaged as being done "for the greater good", will be communist-like. Capitalism, in this case, leading to Communism.
