I want to wrap up this section on the evil theme with a story of an example of evil manifested by good people with all good intentions. At the time the incident struck me as being in essence very similar to the concept of fascism, assuming the right to control others, believing themselves to be superior or authorized.

I looked up fascism and came up with this definition:

Any movement, ideology, or attitude that favors dictatorial government, centralized control of private enterprise, repression of all opposition, and favors extreme nationalism. The most notable characteristic of a fascist country is the separation and persecution or denial of equality to a specific segment of the population based upon superficial qualities or belief systems. Simply stated, a fascist government always has one class of citizens that is considered superior (good) to another (bad) based upon race, creed or origin.

Now, although this definition defines fascism in terms of a government, the concept applies also to individuals whose actions dominate others. The story:

Some years ago I built and sold massage tables. One day a woman I knew, Annie, came over with a massage therapist friend Jenni, to look at my tables to maybe buy one. The following is the excerpt from my journals:

Somehow the subject of doing massage without a license came up with me maintaining that why should anyone need the government's approval to choose to pay anyone for a massage. It was a major button for them. Jenni said it's a good thing that massage therapists must be licensed. She had her reasons. Shoddy arguments. They both said, as the conversation developed, that it was very complicated. God, how simple can it be. Choice. Freedom. No victims. She said it was simpler in a state where a license is required; she's not called up for sex. It's like an ad in Penthouse I once saw, about censorship. Yes, now your life is a lot simpler and a little less free.

I explained the Profound Simplicity of choice and she couldn't get past the fear. She was worried that somebody messing with your energy who doesn't know what they are doing could be really bad.

Regarding my views, Annie said they were so idealistic. Yeah, so what?! If not us, who? If not now, when? Haven't we slaughtered and dominated enough for enough centuries, millennia because adults have concluded that ideals are teenage stuff and not attainable in, they say, the "real world."

I'll sit at your round table, Arthur.

It was just amazing hearing Jenni defend a small group of people's right to legislate their ethics. She defended it saying it wasn't the government; it was a group of massage therapists.

God, every fascist state will tell you their experts know best and should decide the standards. Who cares who they are? Who decides who gets to decide?! There are no victims. It really is that simple.

It was weird too. I felt very harsh talking my talk. In the face of their resistance, my concepts were an affront on crystallized concluded battle lines of right and wrong. In a healthy sane world it would have been reversed. Her imposition on my freedom would have seemed very harsh indeed.

The paradigm and hypnosis of fear. It really is the essence of evil. Fear that a world of choice by individuals taking responsibility for themselves is too dangerous and we need control by authorities to protect us.

And how freely and without the simplest critical thinking it is assumed that a particular group of people have a bead on what is right and best and safest and, most importantly, necessary.

It hurts to meet intelligent, caring, sensitive people who just can't see the simplest of freedoms. Choice, victimless crimes.

One more thing. If someone sees the logic and truth in freedom of choice but still thinks we need controls and limits, I ask again:

Can it really be that we live in a world where doing what is right, won't work? It's all so clouded in complex scenarios of tragedy, but it really is so simple.

It comes back to my definition of evil. That battle line of right and wrong is determined by fear. When the light (of reason, of truth) begins to compel a person to face their denials but threatens to compromise what they perceive as their security, it is at this point, if the light does not prevail, where they begin to need to control their environment, abusing and dominating others (beings, creatures, nature) to protect their lie and avoid having to deal with complexities and their personal inner struggle.
