About My Source PDFs

The Source PDFs in this series will differ from some of my other PDFs that cover topics with narrative, quotes from sources, and linked footnotes. Following each link, on the next line the type of source that is linked to will appear in CAPs along with the source. If the title of the linked article, video, patent, or study is self explanatory that may be sufficient while with some links there will also be a brief description. And a few will have excerpts from the source in indented paragraphs.

I have not vetted all of the information contained in the videos and articles. As always don't take my or anybody's word for anything outright. Realize your own agency and recognize that trust in information can be nuanced.

Finally, these source documents will likely be updated from time to time as I find more sources. Check back for newer versions. Note the date under the title above.

Preface

First, if you don't know much about the WEF please check out my PDF, titled, *The World Economic Forum - An Introduction* on my website, which covers some of their big signature projects as well as their reach. It is extremely important to understand the agenda of the WEF because otherwise one might mistakenly think, from all the soft fuzzy words they use like "values", "respect", "community" to describe their focus, that the Young Global Leaders program is pumping out civil servants with integrity.

The World Economic Forum is at the center of the Global Coup now taking place. There are many players but the WEF is, as its name implies, a forum. It and its yearly meetings in Davos, Switzerland, are where plans are made on how best to orchestrate global governance.

Sounds crazy, right? Well, no so much. In my first PDF about them I presented a list of the WEF's Board of Trustees, showing how major influential people from around the world are part of their team and on board with their agenda.

In this PDF the focus is on their Young Global Leaders program. Started in 1992 by Klaus Schwab, initially called the Global Leaders of Tomorrow, and becoming the Forum of Young Global Leaders in 2004, it is essentially a school for people groomed to take positions of power and influence all over the world. Their graduates include many names you will recognize, not surprisingly on board with the Covid narrative and draconian measures.

Representing 70 different nations, Young Global Leaders are nominated by alumni to serve six-year terms and are subject to veto during the selection process. Candidates must be younger than 38 years old at the time of acceptance (meaning active YGLs are 44 and younger), and highly accomplished in their fields.

The Forum of the Young Global Leaders Website

The website for the Young Global Leaders has a page titled "Community" (link below) where the "active" and "alumni" members of the community can be viewed by Year Awarded, Sector, and Region.

But the year awarded option only shows 2016 to 2021 and some members mentioned by Klaus Schwab himself cannot be found by using the search field, so it seems very incomplete. The Forum claims to have been started up in 2004, long after the original program was created, so apparently there are a lot of graduates not represented in the Forum.

Also, although Schwab is often very open about his grandiose plans for global governance, my impression is that the WEF website takes many pages down if they are becoming too infamous. An example would be quite a bit of information about the Fourth Industrial Revolution seems to have been deleted from the WEF website.


